Phelan Wyrick, Ph.D. is a Senior Policy Advisor to the Assistant Attorney General for the Office of Justice Programs (OJP) in the U.S. Department of Justice. He joined the Department in 1998, and has held senior positions in the National Institute of Justice and the Office of Juvenile Justice and Delinquency Prevention. In 2007, he was the recipient of the Attorney General's Award for Outstanding Contributions to Community Partnerships for Public Safety for his work to reduce gang activity and violence. Dr. Wyrick currently leads OJP's Evidence Integration Initiative which includes the development and maintenance of the CrimeSolutions.gov website. Prior to joining the Department, Dr. Wyrick served as a Research Associate in the City of Westminster Police Department in Orange County, California. He received his doctorate in applied social psychology from the Claremont Graduate University.
