The December 10, 2009 meeting of the Law Enforcement Training (LET) Subcommittee, conducted in the Executive Conference Room – Main Complex of the West Virginia State Police Academy, located in Institute, West Virginia, was called to order by the Chair, First Sergeant Tilley, at 10:10 a.m. with six (6) members either present or represented at the meeting.

First Sergeant Tilley informed the members present that there three items that he would like to have added to the agenda for this meeting to be discussed. They were an application for funding for the 141st Basic Class, recommended changes to the entry level training curriculum for the basic class program and a review of a personnel related matter. He asked for the consensus of the members for those present for those items to be added as Agenda items 11, 12 and 13 with current agenda item 10 addressing Other Business to be moved to after their discussion. The members present indicated their consensus agreement that these three items be added for discussion as requested.

The minutes of the October 29, 2009 meeting of the LET Subcommittee had been mailed to the subcommittee members prior to this meeting. First Sergeant Tilley asked the members present if there were any questions or corrections concerning the minutes as sent.

Hearing none he asked if there was a motion to be made concerning the acceptance of these minutes. A motion was made by Retired Corporal Gentry, seconded by Colonel Murphy, that the minutes of the October 29, 2009 subcommittee meeting be accepted as presented to the subcommittee members. There being no discussion on the motion First Sergeant Tilley called for questions. All present voted in favor of, with no negative votes cast, for the motion as made.

First Sergeant Tilley then initiated discussion on Agenda item 2 as to the LET Fund Financial Report by asking Retired Captain Sadler to report on it. First Sergeant Tilley asked Retired Captain Sadler if these classes met the criteria to be approved as personal in-service classes as annual or supervisory as reflected. He indicated that they did and recommended their approval as such.

First Sergeant Tilley asked if there were any questions concerning the recommended classes. Hearing none he asked if there was a motion for their approval.

Colonel Murphy made a motion, seconded by Chief Stephens, that the classes presented and recommended be approved for personal in-service credit for the 2010 Training Year. There being no discussion on the motion First Sergeant Tilley called for questions. All present voted in favor of, with no negative votes cast, for the motion as made.

First Sergeant Tilley then initiated discussion on agenda item 6 by advising the subcommittee members present that it addressed a review of the 2009 Make-up Training Program by Retired Captain Sadler. He asked him to present that review.

Retired Captain Sadler advised that the training had been presented as scheduled and approved at previous LET Subcommittee meetings. The general make-up training had been presented under the oversight of Retired Captain Sadler and the make-up training approved for the Huntington Police Department members had been presented by Sergeant R Petry, West Virginia State Police under the direction of Corporal R Knight, Huntington Police Department. Invoices had been for the officers participating in the classes and were being received.

There being no questions concerning the 2009 Make-up Training Program First Sergeant Tilley then initiated discussion Agenda item 7 by advising the subcommittee members present that it addressed the meeting schedule for the LET Subcommittee during the 2010 calendar training year. As had been the schedule in previous years there would be eleven meetings during the year, with no meeting in November. All of the meetings with the exception of the August 2010 meeting would be held at the West Virginia State Police Academy facilities. The August meeting would be at the Charleston Civic Center preceding the annual meeting of the full Governor's Committee on Crime, Delinquency and Correction.

First Sergeant Tilley asked the subcommittee members present if they had any questions concerning the 2010 meeting schedule for the LET Subcommittee. Hearing none he moved to agenda item 8.

First Sergeant Tilley advised that as it addressed a personnel related matter he asked for a motion for the LET Subcommittee to go into executive session to address it and agenda item thirteen which had been added at the start of the meeting in that it also addressed a personnel related matter.

Retired Corporal Gentry made a motion, seconded by Mr McClung, that the LET Subcommittee go into executive session to address the personnel related matters concerning agenda items 8 and 13. There being no discussion on the motion First Sergeant Tilley called for questions. All present voted in favor of, with no negative votes cast, for the motion as made.

The LET Subcommittee went into executive session at 10:24 am. It came out of executive session at 10:46 am.

First Sergeant Tilley asked if there were any motions to be made concerning agenda items 8 and 13.

Retired Corporal Gentry made a motion concerning agenda item 8, seconded by Mr McClung, that the applicant being considered for employment by the Randolph County Sheriff's Office who had a previous conviction for assault could participate in the entry level training program upon being hired and a completed application submitted to the Academy. All present voted in favor of, with no negative votes cast, for the motion as made.

The members present noted their appreciation of the actions of the administration of the Randolph County Sheriff's Office to self report the conviction in question. That agency's recognition of making the LET Subcommittee and the Academy aware of such a conviction was noted and recognized in that it is more common that it is the Academy and LET Subcommittee staff who must discover the conviction/s and make notice for review.

Ms. Smith then made a motion concerning agenda item 13, seconded by Retired Corporal Gentry, that no certification review be set as to the conviction of Ohio County Sheriff's Office Corporal C Kittle as a result of his conviction for a violation of the state statute addressing computer privacy invasion. There being no discussion on the motion First Sergeant Tilley called for questions. All present voted in favor of, with no negative votes cast, for the motion as made.

First Sergeant Tilley then initiated discussion on Agenda item 11 by advising the members present that it addressed an application by the West Virginia State Police for funding from the LET Fund to operate the 141st Basic Class that would begin January 4, 2010 and run through April 23, 2010. Copies of the grant application were passed out to the members present. First Sergeant Tilley asked Major M DeBord, Director of Training at the West Virginia State Police Academy to discuss the application.

Major DeBord advised that the application was for \$153,468.54 for the operation of the 141st Basic Class. The requested funding was consistent with previous such requests to run an entry level training class. The application had been prepared and processed within the West Virginia State Police and was to be approved by Colonel Pack for submission to Retired Captain Sadler. The request was being discussed today in that the 141st Basic Class would begin prior to the start of the next scheduled LET Subcommittee meeting.

Retired Captain Sadler noted that there were sufficient funds within the LET Fund to cover the funding requested and recommended that it be approved. He noted as well that the approval of the application as presented by the members present would allow him to have the submitted application processed in a timely manner upon submission by the West Virginia State Police so that the grant award would be in place at the time that the 141st Basic Class began.

First Sergeant Tilley asked if there were any questions concerning the application for funding for the 141st Basic Class. Hearing none he asked if there was a motion for its approval.

Chief Stephens made a motion, seconded by Colonel Murphy, that the application by the West Virginia State Police for \$153,468.54 from the LET Fund for the operation of the 141st Basic Class to run January 4, 2010 through April 23, 2010 be approved. There being no discussion on the motion First Sergeant Tilley called for questions. All present voted in favor of, with no negative votes cast, for the motion as made.

First Sergeant Tilley then initiated discussion on agenda item 12 by advising that it addressed a recommended change in the classes constituting the entry level training program for the basic class program. He noted that Major DeBord and Sergeant David Lee, who was responsible for curriculum development and oversight at the Academy were present to discuss the recommended changes and asked them to speak concerning them.

Major DeBord stated that he had asked Sergeant Lee to complete an evaluation of the training schedule for the entry level training program for the basic training classes as to the classes that make it up. The purpose of the evaluation was to ensure that the participating officers are being always being presented with the classes, as to make-up, length and content, that best prepares them to be certified as law enforcement officers in West Virginia. He asked Sergeant Lee to review the results of the evaluation that he had completed.

Sergeant Lee provided the members present with a listing of classes that he had completed as a result of his review of the classes and schedule making up the entry level training program. As reflected on the information presented he had identified classes that either needed to be modified as to length and/or title or to be removed or added to the entry level training class.

He advised that the overall length of the program would remain at sixteen (16) weeks, but that the number of hours of training classes presented within that time period would increase from 820 hours to 835 hours. He reviewed the need for the changes being recommended and asked that the members present approve the recommendations presented to them.

Major DeBord stated that the recommendations had been reviewed with him and that he fully supported the recommended changes. He noted that with the changes being recommended being approved that they would become the classes comprising the entry level training program and that they would be incorporated with the 141st Basic Class beginning January 4, 2010. For future classes, unless a change in the classes being presented was discussed with the LET Subcommittee and approved, that the classes would be approved for successive basic training classes.

Colonel Murphy made a motion, seconded by Mr McClung, that the recommended changes to the entry level training program as presented by the staff of the West Virginia State Police Academy to have the entry level training program continue to be a sixteen week program with classes totaling 835 hours become the required minimum standard for the entry level training program for the

certification of law enforcement officers in West Virginia. First Sergeant Tilley asked if there were any questions concerning the motion.

Chief Stephens had a question as to the fact that with the fact that this item had been added as agenda item at the beginning of the meeting that the members had had no opportunity to review the proposed changes prior to this meeting. Major DeBord advised that the members had been made previously aware of the fact that a curriculum evaluation was being conducted. He recognized that this was short notice as to implementation with the 141st Basic Class, but with the time required to complete the evaluation he had only now been able to present it. He fully supported the recommendations being made from Sergeant Lee and his other staff members and felt that the changes would allow the officers participating in the entry level training classes the training best designed to prepare them for service as law enforcement officers in the state.

An extended discussion followed concerning the recommended schedule as to the classes and classes that were not proposed to be included. Major DeBord did note in relation to classes such as taser and radar/laser that the scheduling of these classes for officers who had completed the basic or cadet classes was being looked at to make them more available for officers in the state. He advised that he was always available to address the concerns and needs of the training of law enforcement officers in the state and as to the interests of the various organizations which represented them.

First Sergeant called for questions after a point that he felt the issues involved in the recommendation of the classes had been fully discussed. As to the motion having been previously made he asked for those in favor and against the recommended changes. All present with the exception of Chief Stephens voted in favor of the recommended changes in the entry level training curriculum becoming the required courses for the entry level training program. Chief Stephens advised that he was voting no as to the fact that the matter had not been given sufficient time for review by the members prior to a vote.

First Sergeant Tilley then addressed agenda item 9 advising the members present that this item addresses the standard report of correspondence/action taken by Retired Captain Sadler on behalf of the members and in his position as LET Coordinator since the October 29, 2009 LET Subcommittee meeting. He asked if there were any questions concerning the information distributed with the agenda mailing or as to general actions taken by Retired Captain Sadler.

Hearing none First Sergeant Tilley then moved to Agenda item 10 and asked if there was any other business that the members wished to discuss. He advised the members present that he wanted to let them know that the firearms simulator system that had been purchased for the Academy through Purdue Pharma grant funding had been received and was now operational at the Academy. The entry level training officers in the 140th Basic Class and the 60th Cadet Class would be able to train on it as to officer decision shooting training and officer survival training in relation to armed incidents. He extended an invitation to

the subcommittee members to arrange with him to look at and train on the system to see how it worked and what it offered to officers.

He asked if there was any other business to be discussed. Hearing none from the other subcommittee members he asked if there was a motion to bring this meeting to a close.

Colonel Murphy made a motion, seconded by Mr McClung, that the December 10, 2009 meeting of the LET Subcommittee be brought to a close. Hearing no discussion on the motion First Sergeant Tilley called for questions. All present voted in favor of the motion as made with no negative votes cast.

The December 10, 2009 meeting of the LET Subcommittee was brought to a close 12 Noon.
